

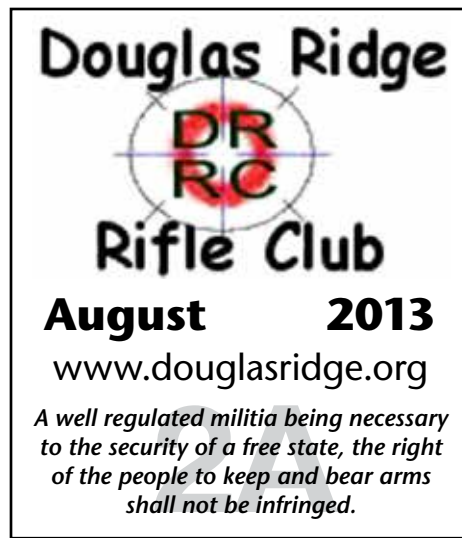
Annual Meeting Election Results

Bob Anderson and Dan Sweet completed their terms on the Board, and their service is also appreciated. Discipline Director Reports

Several of our Disciplines provided reports of their activities recently or over the past year. Here is a summary of what has been happening with the various activities at the range.

Adult Smallbore – Bob Stevens reported that the team had 21 members this past season. They won the championship of the league they compete in, for the first time in 10 years. More folks continue to show interest in the sport, and all are welcome to become involved.

Archery – Justin Jantz has replaced Al Meteney as Director. He is continuing to build the program that Al started, looking

for more opportunities like the recent beginner classes the discipline sponsored.

Black Powder Cartridge – A DRRC team of six BPCR shooters traveled 1,020 miles to Forsyth MT for the June 10-16 Quigley Shoot. The course of fire is six targets at six different ranges, with eight rounds fired at each target. The first target is the short one, only 350 yards, and must be shot offhand. The other targets may only be shot from cross sticks. Monday through Friday were practice days. Saturday, the approximately 600 shooters shot four of the targets, which are scored as 'hit' or 'miss'. The final two targets were shot on Sunday. The best score ever shot on this course is 43/48. Two of the DRRC team members broke 50%, shooting 29/48 and 32/48, putting them in the top 1/3 of the shooters. Also, two times a team member hit a target with all 8 of his shots, earning 'eight straight' pins. These were accomplished at 530 and 600 yards. All in all, Director Dave Kendall reports that it was a very respectable showing by the DRRC team.

Black Powder Muzzleloaders – Don Edwards and the smoke pole shooters are getting ready for an annual rendezvous on Mt. Hood. The monthly shoots have been attracting good crowds, including a group of 4-H youth shooters. The discipline is looking to develop a more permanent knife and tomahawk throwing range.

Handgun Silhouette – Director Greg Watson reports that the monthly matches have been suspended due to the temporary shortening of the Silhouette Range. He will let everyone know as soon as they resume.

Hunter Safety – Larry Warren

is one of the ODFW coordinators and instructors for Clackamas County. This year Larry and his team of instructors conducted a traditional Hunter Ed class, a Master Hunter class, and two Independent Study classes at DRRC.

International Long Range – Stan Pate reports that an August international match will not be conducted at DRRC this year, because it would conflict directly with the World Championships. However, interest is already coming from several international teams about a match next year. And 2015 is expected to be a major international match event at DRRC. Stay tuned for further developments.

Junior Shotgun – Dick Jennings reports that seven juniors participated in the State Championship held at Portland Gun Club. The youngest shooter earned Rookie of the Year honors. Dick expects five or six will compete in the upcoming Grand Pacific PITA match in Washington.

Junior Smallbore – Glen Miller assumed the Director position when Matt Meininger resigned. Since June the growth in participation has tripled; 24 young shooters were at the last weekly shoot. Glen and his assistant Bob Stevens are re-starting the NRA 4 Position shooting program, and some of the new shooters are off to a very strong start. Ryan Jacobs earned a full ride scholarship to the Air Force Academy based on his shooting developed in the Junior program. His brother Spencer Jacobs thanked the membership for supporting his trip to the Junior Olympics in Colorado. Spencer recently shot a 582/600 in air rifle, which is first

in the nation for his classification of Intermediate Junior and a national record.

Ladies Night – Paul Meier reports that the Ladies Night attendance the past year has ranged from three to fourteen shooters, with an average of five. Turnout has been impacted by ammo availability. The program can train the ladies in any type of shooting they want. Most of the ladies come with no shooting experience, while a couple of experienced women instructors come for a tune-up or help with something new. The sessions focus on safety, gun handling, and learning how to shoot. They follow the two basic rules; you have to be safe and you have to have a good time. Beginning shooters will receive a safety orientation, range rules and gun handling techniques. They will then be put on the line with an instructor camped on their shoulder for most of the first session. Our goal is to handle the gun safely, shoot rounds, get used to the noise and people around you handling guns. If you shoot accurately, that's a bonus. Each time you return we will work with you at your level and towards your goals and teach you as fast as you want to learn. Some ladies want to just learn to handle the gun well and shoot or plink. Others are looking at competition type shooting while many carry and want to work on concealed carry skills and drills. Paul says, if you don't have a gun, eyes or ears don't worry, I do and you can borrow them. I just require that you buy the ammo and that I get a phone call before you show up so we can chat and then I hope to remember to bring everything! You can borrow guns from the

ladies while at the session and go home with an idea of what you want to buy when the time is right. I've been working with or running this discipline since 2001. We have a great program and the ladies are successful.

Ladies Pistol Class – Demand remains high for this class. The team of instructors taught five classes in the last year, with a total of fifty-five ladies completing the program. Since the Fall of 2008, two hundred and thirty ladies have gone through the program, which was developed in-house at DRRC. Classes for the rest of 2013 are already booked full. The 2014 class schedule will be coming out later this year. Sign up early, or you won't be able to get in.

Service Rifles – Todd Hanson reports that fifty-seven first time

shooters attended the Friday evening prep classes for the five matches held in the past year. And one hundred and eight total shooters participated in the Saturday matches. Some new people are stepping up to help coach new shooters, teach portions of the class, RSO the matches, and even score targets in the pits for work hours. Special thanks to Charlie and Sheri McAlister, Mark Edwards, Bob Vice, Scott Tedrow, Dave Stahley, and Dave and Daniel Shank for helping to make this discipline run.

Three-Gun – Markus Wigle reports that between ten and twenty-five shooters are participating in the monthly matches. Ammo shortages are hindering participation. However, a proposal to develop additional

shooting bays is being explored, so that bigger turn-outs can be handled in the future.

USPSA – Dan Carpenter's discipline is booming. The last four months have averaged forty-five to forty-eight shooters. And three to four new shooters are emailing each month. Dan is looking for ways to accommodate the increased numbers, while completing the matches in a reasonable amount of time.
