All Board positions are two year terms, and half of them expire each year.

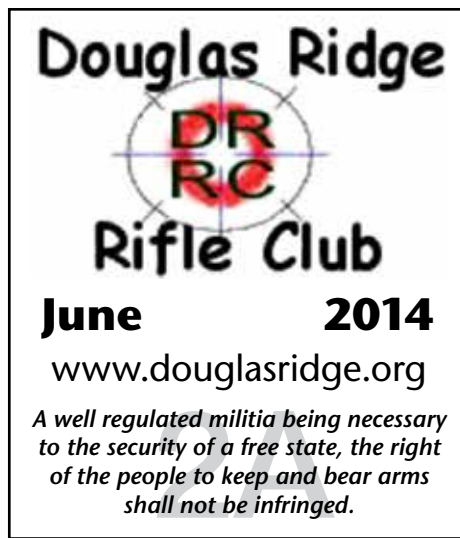
President: Position is up for election. Hal Halverson has served one term, and is eligible to run for a second term.

As most of you who attended the work day on April 19th are aware, as displayed at the clubhouse door, vandalism is alive and well at DRRC. Those of us who show up each Tuesday to repair the damage caused by these vandals are very upset with people who have no respect for club property, which is

OUR property, too.

The cost of these repairs takes away funds from other programs which are intended to promote safe hunting practices and other hunter/gun safety programs.

These acts of vandalism are occurring on ALL ranges, whether it is the 100 yd., the 200 yd., the Dynamic Range, the 1,000 yd., the Silhouette Range or others. Last year we had to take down the "Clangers" due to vandals consistently shooting AP rounds and perforating/destroying the high-grade steel targets.

In addition, it gives a very unsavory impression to new members and visitors to the range by displaying a blatant disregard for club property and overall safety on the range. Just because you pay your dues, doesn't mean you have the right to destroy

our property. If you are bent on destroying property, please destroy your own stuff on your own property.

For those who are the perpetrators of the vandalism, I would offer the following suggestions:

- 1) Cancel your club membership and find another venue for your destructive activities, or
- 2) Modify your personal behavior, act responsibly and share the facilities in a true, sportsman-like manner.
