

DRRC Election

The next Annual Meeting of DRRC is scheduled for 7 p.m. July 7. Election of Officers & Directors for the coming year will be held and voting is by ballot for Board positions. Per our By-laws "all voting is exercised individually and not by proxy". "Only Senior, Old Time, and Life Members are eligible to vote".

The DRRC Board is composed of five (5) Officers, President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Executive officer and six (6) Directors. Terms of office are two years. This July the terms of the President, Secretary, Executive Officer, and three (3) Directors will expire; these are the positions to be voted on. Persons who have completed one two year term are eligible to serve for a second two year term if re-elected by the membership.

Nominations from the floor may be proposed if the nominee is present, meets the position requirements, and has agreed to be nominated and serve if elected, beginning July 7, 2016 through June 30, 2018.

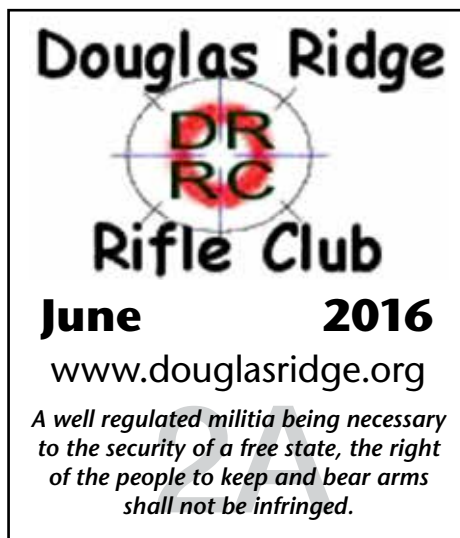
Nominees for DRRC Board of Directors (received as of May 3.)

For President: Tom Hatch

-Tom currently serves as one of the DRRC Directors. Tom has been a police officer for over 26 years. He served as a Marine prior to joining law enforcement. He has experience working with lobbyists, investment professionals and peers, working to create efficient and safe working environments. As president his goal is to work for the DRRC membership, to be open minded to do what is best for our members.

If elected to be President his then vacant Board position will be filled through Board action. That person is eligible to run for election next year for a two year term.

For Secretary: Rick Benjamin - Rick has completed his first two year term as Secretary and is eligible to run for a second term. He has been a member of DRRC since 1987 and



as an RSO since 2012. He is a life member of NRA and CRPA and a member of OSSA. He served in the US Marines, 1975-81.

For Treasurer: Larry Farey - Larry has completed his first two year term as Treasurer and is eligible to run for a second term. He has worked to improve fiscal accountability through QuickBooks software and fiscal reporting. He is currently managing small business companies for his wife and his business - Suburban Firearms.

For Executive Officer: Ben Edman - Ben has completed his first two year term as Executive Officer and is eligible to run for a second term. His primary duty is to maintain the club calendar. This is a challenging job involving interaction with many individuals and agencies. He is responsible to screen all requests for use of DRRC facilities and communicate requests from agencies, shooting disciplines, individuals, to appropriate DRRC Officers and the DRRC Board. He has streamlined the scheduling process through use of electronic forms and links.

For Board of Directors - (Vote for 3 Director Positions): Bill Trousdale - Bill has completed his first two year term as a Director and is eligible to run for a second term. Active as Discipline Director and shooter for Silhouette and a Director at the state level for 6 years.

Steve Irving - Steve has been a member of DRRC for about

26 years. In early the 2000's he served as a Director two terms on the Board. He is eligible to run again. He has served in the past as a Discipline Director for Muzzle Loaders for twelve years.

Jack Regele - Jack has been a member of DRRC since 1993. He has served in the past as a Director for DRRC for two terms and is eligible to run again. His particular shooting interests are black powder cartridge and shooting muzzle loaders.

Pete Tewes - Pete has been a member of DRRC for a bit over three years. He is a club RSO and Life NRA and IHMSA member. His interests include handloading and the arbor press. Pete is active in the metallic silhouette and rimfire challenge disciplines. He is employed as an automation and control engineer for OHSU.

I ended up coming back strong and only finishing a point behind the previous day's performance.

Overall I was happy with my performances in each event. Obviously I wanted to do better and am only focusing on the points I could've easily picked up, but I shot exactly how I should've shot.

That's what "handicap" means; all shooters stand up and compete head to head on that day. Usually one of the 27 yard shooters wins; they are very good shooters. That's how they get to the 27 yard line. Due to his win on Saturday, Dylan will no longer shoot from the 19 yard line; he was awarded a yard and will now shoot from the 20 yard line. Each

added yard is a great honor in a trap shooters career.

Congratulations to all of our young shooters, I am very proud of our program and thank you for supporting us.

Successful Season for Adult Smallbore

The Adult Smallbore team, competing in the Columbia Willamette Rifle League, brought home the 1st place team award for the fourth year in a row at the league banquet on April 16th. DRRC team members Spencer Jacobs, Bob Stevens, Levi Clark, and Tracy Keenan Lloyd were awarded 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 8th individual

aggregate honors. Spencer and Levi are junior shooters who started their training in the DRRC junior program. Spencer shot an NRA Average of 99.15 for the season. Bob's NRA Average was 98.614, barely edging Levi, who shot 98.594.

Cindy Geddis brought home awards for 1st Marksman (Standing Position) and 3rd Marksman (Aggregate). Glen Miller was awarded for shooting a perfect Kneeling Position, shooting 10 matches without dropping a point. Other team members achieved highest personal scores, including Bryan Geddis, Cindy Geddis, and Kaylee Lynn.
