The range is looking great, better than I can ever remember it looking due to the very hard work of some very dedicated volunteers. We are as always in need of additional volunteers to help with the many projects that we have in the works at DRRC. The Project Director Ron Carey would be more than happy to have any help that you could offer him towards the completion of one of the many projects.

With the coming weather that we have learned to expect from living here in Oregon it is time to dig out the colder weather clothes, and plan our shooting events for primarily under one of the covered shooting areas or on the indoor range (if you care about getting wet anyway). With the work done on the footpath last year of the 100/200 yard range it should be fairly pleasurable to use this range this coming winter compared to the previous Fall, Winter, and Spring Seasons.

On the legal front there is some news to update you on. All of the legal cases that DRRC is involved in have now been submitted for summary judgment to the respective judges. The two environmental suits brought on by our former



member were submitted for summary judgment and now have a scheduled hearing date before the judge of November 10th of this year. In support of our former members law suit against DRRC three former members have filed affidavits as well as one current member.

The NRA has sent DRRC another \$5,000 check to help in our legal defense financing, bringing our total from the NRA to \$25,000 to date. It has been suggested by the NRA that we apply again for another defense fund grant from the NRA for consideration in the upcoming quarterly meeting.

At the last general membership meeting one of our junior shooters that the club helped to make the trip to Camp Perry gave a report of her trip. Jerrika Wallace laid out her nine medals and spoke of the highlights of her memorable trip and what she was able to accomplish there. She is an inspiring young lady who in addition to winning nine medals also maintains a straight "A" average in school, and a positive attitude to boot. Her grandmother stood and offered her thanks to our club for being there to teach Jerika the joys and discipline of competitive shooting. Jerrika did well enough to qualify her to a three day class taught by the Marine Corps Rifle Team for junior shooters, way to go young lady.

Mandatory Reporting

Remember to report to the ODFW if you are a tag holder, whether you harvested an animal or not. You can go online to: <https://or.outdoorcentral.us/or/hunterreport> or call 1-866-947-ODFW (6339) and use the Automated Phone System.

You'll need to have the following information ready:

- Hunter/Angler ID number (located on ODFW licenses, tags and applications).
- The two digit Wildlife Management Unit (WMU) number of the Unit you hunted in most of the time if the hunt area included more than 1 WMU.
- The total number of days hunted – including mentoring youth – and the number of days hunted in the WMU hunted most.

By completing the mandatory

hunter report, you are providing key pieces of information that biologists will use in their game management actions. Your report supports the agency's goal of optimizing recreational opportunities for all hunters.

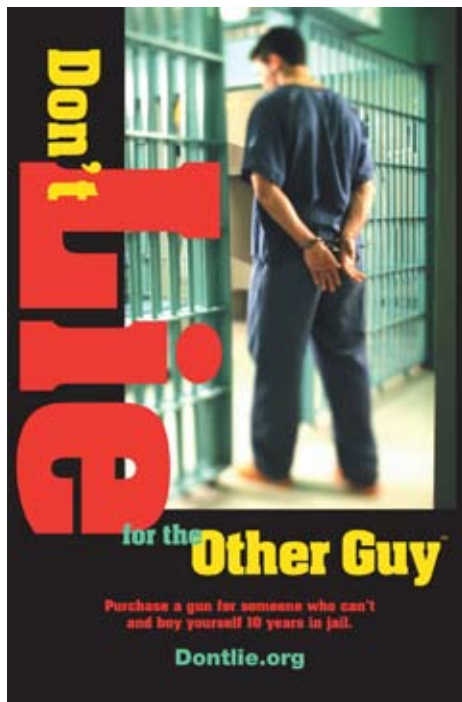

Purchasing a gun for someone who is prohibited by law from possessing one, or for someone who does not want his or her name associated with the transaction, is a "straw purchase," a Federal crime punishable by up to 10 years in prison and a fine of up to \$250,000.

Buying a gun for another person who is prohibited can cost you your good name and land you in big trouble. Never buy a gun for someone who is unwilling or unable to do so.
