First, I want to **thank everyone** who showed up for the January Membership meeting. It was quite a surprise to see a full room. It would be nice to see that many folks all the time.

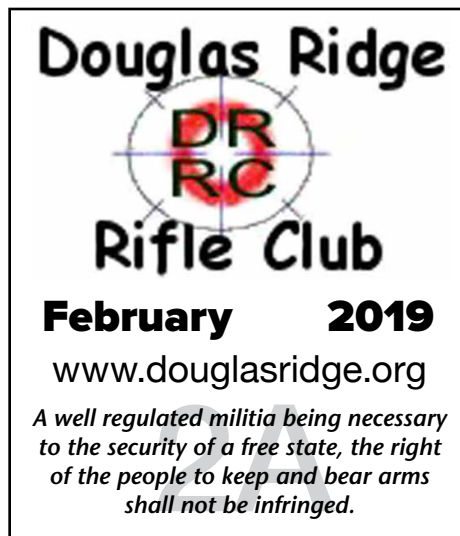
Also, please let us know how you like getting the agenda and approved meeting minutes by email. It lets us know if we are doing the right things to keep you all informed.

Calendar Usage

I have received a few questions recently about how to use the online Club Calendar. It is good to check it before coming to the range to make sure the range you intend to use is open. There is also a hard copy posted at the gate and on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse next to the Office door.

To find the Club Calendar on the Club's webpage, click on the Calendar tab. Clicking on the website's Club Calendar link brings up the page with the calendar codes (range abbreviations) and

legal sunset time link. Clicking on DRRC Main Web Calendar brings up the current month and today's date is highlighted. To advance to the next month, click on the arrow to the right of the month shown. Clicking on the activity or event shown for a given day brings up who to contact, cost, and other useful information.

There is a search box on the page's upper left. Clicking on it brings up a search box. Typing in 3 Gun, for example, brings up all the scheduled matches for the year. Use your browser's left arrow to go back to the monthly calendar.

Another way to search is to click on the dropdown box below the date labeled Select Category. You can easily find classes and training, meetings and matches by selecting one or more boxes and clicking on the Go box to the right of the dropdown.

Another useful feature is the Go To Date. Clicking on it brings up a monthly calendar. Click on the date of your next day off, for instance, and all the activities for that day are listed either by the month, week or day, depending on the box you have selected to the right of the Go button.

If you need additional information you can click on the Help button, which has directions on using the main navigation buttons and additional controls. Click away and explore the Club Calendar, you cannot alter or delete any of the information shown.

Service Rifle Training

The first class and match this year is coming up soon, Friday, March 22 and Saturday, March 23

We have starting a new position for our match bench rest. Over

the last 2 years of running this program we have had a lot of people that have not been able to get in to the three positions used in nominal matches. Every one that comes out has a great time, we have lots of experienced shooters that love to coach and help other people learn.

The total number of shooter is limited to 36 so please sign up early.

ODFW website

On December 1, 2018, ODFW launched a new electronic license system that allows customers to print their licenses/tags at home, carry them on a phone, or buy at a license sales agent. Before making their next purchase, customers who have big game preference points, Pioneer License, Disability Permit, NW Goose Certification or have purchased an annual license in the last three years (2016-18) need to verify their account.

Use the Verify/Look Up Account button at the MyODFW licensing page to verify your account online, or go to a license sales agent or ODFW office. Bring a 2018 license or tag and use your Hunter/Angler ID # (now the ODFW ID#) to find your account. More info at myodfw.com/articles/odfws-new-

Goal 3: Expand support for fish, wildlife and their habitats. Much of ODFW's work to protect and enhance fish, wildlife and their habitats is funded by the relatively small number of people who hunt and fish. As the state's population increases and our climate changes, there will be greater impacts on the environment. The challenges of restoring and enhancing fish and wildlife populations, and their habitats, will increase significantly. ***All of this is at a time when revenue from hunters and anglers continues to decline.*** Successfully

addressing these challenges and conserving Oregon's fish and wildlife is possible only with adequate funding from a broader constituency.

- Align budgets with ODFW conservation and management priorities beginning with the 2019-2021 biennium.
- ***Increase revenue from ALL ODFW customers (hunters, anglers, viewers, supporters, outdoor recreationists) by 15 percent by June 30, 2019.***
- Diversify and increase base funding by 15 percent by June 30, 2019.
- Develop ODFW fundraising efforts to expand and diversify grant funding sources by 15 percent and increase donation revenue by 25 percent by June 30, 2019
